



### STRIPPERS CLUB 2015-2016

- $\Rightarrow$  Colour: Browns (modern), earth tones
- $\Rightarrow$  9 strips of fabric, cut on the 42" width only.
- ⇒ Each strip of fabric should be 22" wide so you can get 4 lengths from each strip.
- ⇒ All fabric must be unwashed fabric.
- ⇒ Fabrics must have selvages on them as this is the way to ensure they are cut straight.
- $\Rightarrow$  One strip per month, starting September, ending May for a total of 9.
- ⇒ Each strip must have a sticker or masking tape with your name (no pins or staples) this will ensure that when the fabric is being cut, your sticker will still be in place.
- $\Rightarrow$  100% good quality quilters' cotton. No decorator fabric. Give as good as you would like in return.
- $\Rightarrow$  Do not use perfume in the water of your irons when you press your fabric.
