

More quilts to be made, another quilter in distress.



Double Disappearing double 9 patch.

Cut for each large

These are the colours we chose but you are welcome to choose any combination you like

- 1 5" blocks -colour 1 dark mauve
- 4 5" blocks colour 2 pastel yellow
- 4 5" blocks colour 3 grey
- 4 7" blocks colour 4 bright yellow
- 1 7" block colour 1 dark mauve

Using the 5 " blocks, make a 9 patch block as shown.

Picture 1



Measure the inside blocks (ours were 4 1/2 inches) and cut through the centre vertically and horizontally into 7 1" blocks to match the 7" blocks of colour you cut at the beginning.

Picture 2.



Make a nine-patch block using your single dark solid in the centre, the four bright coloured squares as the top, bottom and two sides next to it and the four pieces from the first square as the four corners.

Picture 3



Now slice your block horizontally and vertically through the centre. As shown in picture 4



Pictures 5 through 7 show some ways of arranging your blocks to make a quilt

Add some borders and Voila - a lap quilt!


Verna Radford is fairly new to quilting. And she is making amazing things!
