Saturday, February 20, 2021

TRICORN PLACEMATS designed by Sue Baldauf,

(based on Laura Coia's Not So Square Placemat)

We are pleased to bring you a workshop on Zoom. Before Covid-19, we were prepared to make the Tricorn placemats based on Laura Coia's "Not So Square" placemat pattern seen at the guild meeting in the fall of 2019.

If you signed up previously, you will have been contacted to reimburse your payment. At this time, we will be presenting this workshop free of charge.

Below, we have listed the supply list so you can prepare your fabric selection for the workshop. Please contact Kelly K. or Brenda K. by February 8, to get your name on the list to receive the instructions.

## **MATERIALS NEEDED:**

5 coordinating Fabrics plus binding and backing

Fabric A and B Light colours - 1/4 yd. or 1 FQ each
Fabric C and D Darker colours - 1/4 yd. or 1 FQ each

Fabric E Feature Fabric - 1/2 yd.

Binding is 1/4 yd. (suggestion to use either Fabric C or D)

Backing is 1 and 1/2 yd. Batting is 1 and 1/2 yd.

# Keep Safe - Sew a Shopping Cart Handle Cover

Cut two coordinating fabrics - 6" x 18" rectangles
Cut one fusible fleece or light batting- 6" x 18" rectangle
Cut %" x 15" Velcro® hook and loop tape

#### Assemble Handle Cover

- Iron fusible fleece to the wrong side of (1) fabric rectangle.
- Place fabric rectangles, right sides together, and pin. Using a 1/4" seam allowance, sew around all four sides, leaving an opening in the center of one long side (about 6") for turning. Reinforce stitches at beginning and end of opening. Clip corners.
- Turn unit right side out, and push out corners.
- · Turn edges of opening under 1/4" and press.
- Topstitch 1/8" around entire rectangle, which will close the opening.
- Refer to Figure 1 to position hook tape on one side of your handle cover.
- Sew 1/8" around entire hook tape. Refer to Diagram 2 to position loop tape on the other side of your handle cover.
- · Sew 1/8" around entire loop tape.

Note: When washing the handle cover, close the Velcro® strips to prevent lint buildup. The handle cover is easily stored in a Ziplock® bag in your purse.




#### MESSAGE FROM OUTREACH

Peter Byrne is excited to offer a 2-day workshop event to members of Paris Quilting Bees (members and non-members). The workshop will run from 10am until 2pm each day.

Peter's hover-quilt titled "Pathways" was showcased in Curated Quilts, Issue/11, in The Appliqué Gallery. The Virtual Hover-quilting Inspiration Workshop is designed around this quilt!

Hover-quilting is a new form of raw edge appliqué, absent of fusible web. This innovative technique produces not only a beautiful controlled frayed edge, but also creates the illusion of your piecing to hovering above the quilt top.

On day one, students will focus on preparing their quilt sandwich and make 36 HST's and on day two will complete a 16inch square, mini hover-quilt. Students will learn the unique design elements that make this technique so versatile and creative.
