- Did you know that for the past 20 years, with the use of computers instead of typewriters, there is no double-spacing after sentences?
- ⇒ 'Nothing Says you are Over 50 Like Two Spaces after a Period!'

How Two Spaces Evolved between sentences

If you learned to type on a typewriter before word processors became the norm, two spaces after a period were required and taught as correct. The extra space was needed to delineate the beginning of a new sentence because the spacing between words was uneven on a typewriter. It is no longer used.
