December Demo with Cathy Eagles

Spool Block and Xs Block C. Eagles
(2 for the price of 1) Lising 22" strips, by width of fabric (WOF) For 12 small blocks (6 of each type), you will need 6 background strips and 6 printed strips. (Yields 6 small (8") blocks and 12 large.

- 1. For one strip set: Sew a background strip to each side of a printed strip. Press to the printed strip.
- 2. For second strip set: Sew a printed strip to each side of the background strip 3. With right sides together, seams nesting, sew the strip steps together along the top and bottom.











- 5. Sew down the opening sides of each section.
- 6. Cut along both diagonals for each section. Press open.
- Join 4 As for the Spool Block Trim to 8".
- 8. Join 4 "Bs" for the Xs block. Trim to B+

- 10. Join 4 Xs Blocks for
 - Mega Xs Block. (151)









From Your Outreach Committee...



Hello, busy Quilters!

It has been an interesting year as we move through the pandemic and begin to meet and socialize more with our family and friends. As the year winds down, I would like to let you know that I will be finishing up with Quilts of Valour. There is a lady in the Kitchener - Waterloo area who is the closest Representative, currently.

I am deeply grateful for the generous donations of time, material and quilts that many of the ladies and the Guild have provided.

A couple of months ago, the Executive reached out to me and offered several quilts for QoV. I explained to them that I was winding down from that organization. They still wanted to outreach the veteran community.

This past year I had the privilege to do some training with Fireteam K9. They are a Veteran owned, non-profit that provides trained service dogs to Veterans and First Responders. They opened up just as the pandemic had started. Their staff and volunteers are all from the veteran and first responder families.

Fireteam K9 have been certified and supported by Wounded Warriors Canada and Ontario Legion Command.

JACKIE'S ICED SHORTBREAD COOKIES

Ingredients for cookie:

8 ounces of very soft butter (2 sticks or 1/2 lb)

1/2 cup of powdered sugar

1 tsp vanilla extract

1 3/4 cups of all purpose flour

1/4 cup of cornstarch

Instructions:

- -line 2 cookie sheets with parchment paper
- in medium bowl add butter, vanilla and powdered sugar. Mix with wooden spoon until fluffy and well blended.
- add flour and cornstarch stir until flour is incorporated and the dough is shaggy, press into a ball and knead a few times until a ball forms.
- remove half of dough to a lightly floured surface and roll out to 3/8 inch thickness.
- cut out with cookie cutters and keep rolling leftover pieces with remaining dough and cut out until no dough remains.
- place cookies on cookie sheets and place in freezer for 10 minutes. (This will allow the cookies to keep their shape and not spread).
- place in preheated 350 degree oven and bake for 12 to 16 minutes or just until bottom edges start to golden. DO NOT OVERBAKE! If your oven does not heat evenly, rotate pans halfway through baking time. Let cool before icing.

The trick to shortbread is to let oven come back up to temperature between pans, and make sure dough has been chilled.

Icing:

2 cups of powdered sugar

4 to 5 tablespoons of lemon juice (fresh or bottled)

a few drops of lemon flavouring

colouring if desired

- hold cookie upside down press into icing. Lift and rotate to allow excess to drip off. Turn right-side up and let dry overnight if you are going to stack them. Store in a box or open container with paper towel or tea towel on top. Cookies freeze well in Ziplock bags but icing will get wrinkly.

KRISPIE MARS BAR RECIPE BY DIANE SITZER

- melt 1/2 cup butter with 4 regular size Mars bars
- stir constantly over low heat until creamy.
- Remove from heat
- ◆ Mix in 3 cups rice crispies. Place gently into baking dish. Cover and let cool (do not refrigerate). Enjoy!


