Our June guild meeting will be a Social. The Outreach committee will treat us as they SHOW OFF all the work that they have done this year.





BOOK REVIEW by Roseline Dufour

The Civil War Diary Quilt (2005) by Rosemary Youngs

When Kim, our Guild librarian, gave me this book to do a book review, I immediately thought: Oh no, not another history book! But this book is more than a history book as it lets you read actual diary entries from 10 women living during the Civil War.

Women were affected by the war as much as the soldiers who served in it. Through the journals and diaries, you get a firsthand account of their attitudes and experiences during the war. Quilts became symbols of political views, symbols of mourning used to bury soldiers and signals for the Underground Railroad. Out of the 121 quilt blocks, several caught my attention.



Was it the entries or the complexity of the blocks that touched my heart? Whatever the reason, I hope someday to be able to reproduce them in a small project. I challenge other quilters who read this reference tool to create a connection with these ten women and maybe recreate the 121 blocks.

SHOW OFF YOUR SHOW AND TELL



JUNE CANADIAN HISTORY TRIVIA


- In 1996, February 15 was declared Canada's National Flag Day



BHQG BOM 2016 June - Square in a Square

This is a 12"block finished (12 1/2" unfinished). It makes an easy block that works up quickly.




FABRIC



3 coordinating colours Cut one 6 1/2 in. square. Cut two (20 in. x 3 1/2 in.) strips in the other two colours.

CUTTING Cut the strips into four rectangles (3 1/2 in.x 6 1/2 in.) four squares (3 1/2 in.)



SEWING INSTRUCTIONS



Using a scant 1/4 in. seam allowance sew pairs of rectangles and pairs of squares right sides together. Press seams to darker fabric.


Position the two pairs of rectangles and the two pairs of squares as shown in photo to left.

Sew the square pairs to the sides of the centre. Press seams to the centre.

Sew the rectangle pairs to the top and bottom. Press seams away from the centre.

Trim new block to 12 1/2 in.
