This month sounds equally exciting as we welcome Noshi Gulati as our guest speaker.



NANCY ZIEMAN shows how to make the **STITCH** 'N **TURN** technique of making quick quilted placemats.

- Cut 2 fabric layers and 1 batting layer 20" x 14".
- Use chalk to mark bias lines on placemat.
- Pin layers together.
- Stitch along one marked bias line. Turn the placemat 1/4 turn, stitch along next marked bias line. Repeat until all marked lines are sewn.
- Trim placemat to desired size.
- Use your favourite binding technique to apply binding around edges...watch the video for more details and a demonstration

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

BOM FOR THE NEW YEAR - JANUARY TO MAY 2016

This Block of the Month project will be for the second part of our 2015-16, lasting for 5 months from January to May 2016. Particularly for the beginner quilters, the block patterns will be to introduce basic techniques. The photo instructions will be included in the newsletter.

In March, your photo instructions included in this newsletter show how to use a SNOWBALL block technique to make a Bunny Face. The instructions use the typical

Easter colours of purple and yellow. In the Canadian theme, the Easter bunny wears a Bowtie made with Canadiana fabric. The pattern outlines how the block may be used to make a placemat but this is optional.

This block technique SNOWBALL does not need to be made into a placemat. If you prefer to collect these BOM blocks each month for your own personal quilt sampler, that is your choice. You may be able to incorporate this Snowball technique in your historical CANADIANA placemat if you wish. Sue Baldauf and BOM Committee

CELEBRATE CANADA'S 150th ANNIVERSARY WITH 150 PLACEMATS

The project's goal is to have a collection of at least 150 CANADIANA placemats for Outreach to distribute in 2017. Before that happens, this collection of Canadiana placemats will be on display at the Bell Homestead in June 2017 as part of the historical celebrations.

Our collection of placemats should reflect something CANADIAN and be a SPECIFIC Year of Canada's history. At the

guild meetings, Becky McAlister has been assigning years to members and has shared information about Canada's history year by year. Each month, she will add more historical tidbits in the CANADIAN HISTORICAL QUILT TRIVIA section of this newsletter. ach month, we will collect any completed CANADIANA placemats.



Each placemat should have the label prepared by Becky. When you bring in a placemat, your name will be added to that month's draw for a prize.

CANADIAN HISTORICAL QUILT TRIVIA

- ⇒ In 1884, the Rideau Rebels, one of Canada's first hockey teams was formed, two of the governor generals' sons played for the team their father Lord Stanley, who later donated the Stanley Cup
- ⇒ The Confederation Bridge which links PEI to New Brunswick opened on May 31, 1997
- ⇒ In 1889, George Grant Mackay built the original Capilano Suspension Bridge
- ⇒ The Canadian musical "Billy Bishop Goes To War" premiered in Vancouver on November 3, 1978.
- ⇒ May 24, 1930 Group of Seven painter Robert Bateman was born. Not only was he a painter, he was a naturalist as such, one could depict 1930 by using flying geese or bear paw quilt patterns


LIBRARY NEWS



ONTARIO'S HERITAGE QUILTS by Marilyn I. Walker


BOOK REVIEW

Guild members designing quilt blocks to celebrate Canada's sesquicentennial will find inspiration in Marilyn Walker's "Ontario's Heritage Quilts". The author studied more than 2,000 quilts to make a selection of those covered in her book, and she acknowledges local Guilds, including Simcoe County Quilters and Niagara Heritage Quilters, as contributors. Some of the quilts have been treasured and cared for over the years; others were neglected, ultimately purchased at garage sales for a pittance.

Many of the gorgeous photographs are taken at historical sites in the province. Ms. Walker has sought out quilts from the early 1800s onward, and has researched brief histories of the women's who sewed them. Of course, "quilting bees" often figured in their lives - aspects of the "bee" live on


today, as we gather in our guilds to socialize, show off our latest projects, trade fabrics, and learn about our craft.


Space does not allow for a list of the patterns included. Suffice to say that it is a most impressive inventory, illustrating the skill and artistry of women whose lives were physically demanding, and who worked without the advantages of modern fabrics and machines. The second half of the volume is dedicated to chapters on quilt "families": Star, Crazy, Log Cabin, Appliqué, Paper Cut, etc.; and her final chapter includes patterns for Jacob's Ladder, Friendship Circle and a Wreath of Wild Roses adaptation.






BHQG BOM 2016 - PLACEMATS FOR CANADA'S 150TH March - SNOWBALL EASTER BUNNY wearing CANADIANA BOWTIE

The **SNOWBALL** block is a great pattern to use for I SPY blocks. Here the basic technique is used repeatedly in the making of this Easter Bunny Placemat.

CUTTING FABRICS

White Bunny Fabric - 1 square (6 1/2 in.) for the face

1 square (3 1/2 in.) for ears

2 squares (2 1/2 in.) for tips of ears

Pink fabric for inner ears - 2 rectangles (2 1/2 in. X 4 1/2 in.)

Canadiana fabric for Bowtie - 2 rectangles (2 1/2 in. X 3 1/2 in.)

1 rectangle (1 1/2 in. x 2 1/2 in.)
Background Purple - 2 rectangles (3 1/2 in. x 9 1/2 in.)

9 squares (2 1/2 in.) (from1 strip 2 1/2 in. x 22 1/2 in.)


1 square (3 1/2 in.)

1 rectangle (2 in. x 12 1/2 in.)

Side Strips to make the Placemat 3 strips (2 1/2 in. x 13 in.)







INSTRUCTIONS

Start by taking 2 white and 8 only of the purple 2 1/2 in. squares. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner on the wrong side of each square. The lines will remain on the quilt so use a marker that will not bleed. Pencil or chalk are good choices.


- A. Bunny Face / SNOW BALL BLOCK
- 1. Align 4 marked background corner squares at the 4 corners of the 6 1/2 in. square right sides together with raw edges even. See photo on right.





- 2. Sew along the marked diagonal lines.
- 3. Trim away excess fabric at seam leaving 1/4 in. seam allowance.
- 4. Flip corners open. Press seam outward at the corners. Press carefully to avoid stretching the corners out of shape.
- 5. Trim SNOWBALL block to 6 1/2 in. square.


B. Same technique for INNER EARS



- 1. See photo on the left. Align 2 marked background corner squares with the 2 ends of pink inner ear rectangles.
- 2. Sew along the marked diagonal lines.
- 3. See photo on the right. Trim away excess fabric at seam leaving 1/4 in. seam allowance.
- 4. Flip corners open. Press seam outward at the corners.



C. Same technique for CANADIANA BOWTIE



- 1. See photo on the left. Align 2 marked background corner squares with the 2 bottom of bowtie rectangles.
- 2. Sew along the marked diagonal lines.
- 3. See photo on the right. Trim away excess fabric at seam leaving 1/4 in. seam allowance.
- 4. Flip corners open. Press seam outward at the corners.



D. Same technique for TIPS OF BUNNY EARS





- 1.See photo on the left.
- 2.Take the 2 marked white 2 1/2 in. squares. Align the white corner squares with the top corners of the rectangles.
- 3. Sew along the marked diagonal lines.
- 4. Trim away excess fabric at seam leaving 1/4 in. seam.
- 5. Flip corners open. Press seam outward.





- 1. Take the 2 squares (3 1/2 in.), white and background.
- 2. Mark the white square with a diagonal line.
- 3. Layer 2 squares with right sides together.
- 4. Sew 2 lines 1/4 in. on each side of the marked line.
- 5. Cut on the marked line.





F. FINISH THE CANADIANA BOWTIE

- Take the last 2 1/2 in. background square and bowtie rectangle 1 1/2 in. x 2 1/2 in. Sew together to make center of bowtie.
- 2. Sew together as shown in the photo.
- 3. Section should measure 6 1/2 in. x 3 1/2 in.



G. FINAL ASSEMBLY OF SNOWBALL EASTER BUNNY



- 1. Now you have all the sections, Assemble all the sections together as shown in photo on the left.
- 2. First sew the CANADIANA BOWTIE section to the BUNNY FACE section.
- 3.Add the TIPS OF EARS to both sides of bunny face section. This section should measure 9 1/2 in. x 12 1/2 in.
- 4. Next join the 4 parts of the BUNNY EARS.
- 5. Continue to assemble as shown in photo on right.
- 6. Add the final strip of background to the top of the SNOWBALL EASTER BUNNY block. This should measure 12 1/2 in x 13 in.




H. MAKE A PLACEMAT

- 1. Complete the placemat by adding 3 strips of 2 1/2 in. width.
- 2. Layer top, backing and batting together. Secure together with quilting lines. Stitch face on bunny.
- 3. Square up edges. Add binding.
- 4. The final size should be 13 in. x 18 1/2 in.
