




block. You could make an entire quilt using just 1 block or use them all!



Suzi-Q Youth Challenge 2019

Guidelines:

This year the challenge is to complete a quilt based on the theme "Technology and Me" using any style of quilting, such as art, traditional and/or modern.

The quilt MUST include in a visible manner, all or part of, an eight-inch square of challenge fabric. which you can obtain by sending a stamped and self-addressed envelope to:

- · The quilt can be any size up to a 200-inch perimeter, but a smaller size may be easier to
- o The quilt must be made of three layers and be quilted, either by hand and/or machine.
- o It must be either bound or closed along the edges with either hand- and/or machine-stitching.
- Most of the quilt must be the work of the young quilter.
- o The quilter may use any combination of hand- and/or machine-piecing, appliqué and quilting
- o The use of embellishments such as beads, embroidery, fibers, ribbon, paint, crayon, etc., is the choice of the young quilter. This is an opportunity to experiment and try new things!
- · The entry must be free of any text or images that are protected by copyright unless you have written permission from the holder of the copyright.
- o For any patterns or designs that are not your own, please give credit to the source.
