Bring your bagged lunch or plan to go out for lunch and/or dinner at the fun restaurants and eating establishments in St George.



BOOK REVIEW by Kitty Gill

I have been wanting to try paper piecing for quite some time now, but any books and internet information on doing it left me very confused. The nice ladies in the library found me a book that was just what I needed.

The book is called **KIDS CAN PAPER PIECE** by Shirley Liby. It is meant to teach kids the method - an experienced sewer can skip the first few pages. The step by step instructions to produce a paper pieced block were concise and simple to follow.

The first steps were followed by some examples of blocks that could be done with this method. I found a star pattern that I am going to make this coming week.

I recommend this book for anyone who finds paper piecing hard or confusing. It will clear things up nicely.




LIBRARY NEWS






Roberta Bondar became the first Canadian woman in space in 1992.





BHQG BOM 2016 - New Techniques

May - MAPLE LEAF - MARKING WITH A PRESS LINE INSTEAD OF PENCIL

This MAPLE LEAF pattern uses a shortcut method of marking that works very well. Instead of drawing a diagonal line with pencil, just use a pressing line as your guide. Follow these instructions to experiment with this new technique.




CUTTING FABRIC



From background fabric
Cut 2 squares 3 1/2 inches
Cut 2 squares 4 1/2 inches
From the leaf fabric
Cut 3 squares 3 1/2 inches
Cut 2 squares 4 1/2 inches
Cut 1 strip (1 in. x 5 1/2 inches)

SEWING WITH NEW TECHNIQUE

- Match the 4 1/2 in. squares with background and leaf fabric together.
- To mark a diagonal line on the lighter fabric, use your iron to press the marking line instead of a pencil.
- 3. Flatten it out lightly and pin.





- 4. Sew a seam 1/4 inch on each side of the marked line.
- 5. Cut on the line.
- 6. Open and press to the darker fabric.
- 7. Trim the 4 new half-square triangle squares to 3 1/2 inches each.



- 8. Now make the leaf stem unit. Again, use your **new technique** to iron to press the marking line on one 3 1/2 in. background square.
- 9. Press the 1 x 5 1/2in. strip in half. Place the raw edge of the folded strip along the marked press line. Pin.



10. Sew a seam of only 1/8 inch. Fold stem back over the seam. Press.




11. Finish by hand-stitching or machine stitch the folded edge down. Trim.

- Assemble all 3 squares in the order shown to make a Maple Leaf pattern.
- Sew the rows separately as top , middle and bottom.
- 14. Press the seams in each row in opposite directions so the final joining has seams fitting together nicely.
- 15. Trim square to 9 1/2 inches.
