DAYS FOR GIRLS October was International Month of the Girl.

Aline supports this group and have been asked what it is about. With Sue B's permission, we are posting the info here.

Around the world, girls and women resort to using rags, mattress stuffing, banana leaves, feathers, and even cow dung to manage their menstruation.

Days for Girls provides a safe, beautiful, washable, and long-lasting alternative — along with vital health education.



Without a solution to manage her monthly cycle:

1 in 10 girls in Sub-Saharan Africa... 113 million adolescent girls in India... 30% of girls in rural Brazil... will miss school this year.

Canadian high schools are now requesting these pads for local girls who cannot afford sanitary pads.

The **Supreme Days for Girls Kit** is the deluxe version of a Kit, and what is made by our Chapters and Teams around the world.

You may notice that these Kits don't look like traditional pads...and there's a reason for that. The bright colors camouflage staining. The absorbent liners unfold to look like a washcloth, which allows women to wash and dry them outside in the sun without causing embarrassment. All of these design choices add up to a lasting, easy-to-care-for solution.

LINER PATTERN

The liners are made of absorbent flannel. Not all flannels are made alike. Purchase the highest quality flannel you can. It should be tightly woven. Be aware, all flannel shrinks 3-6%. Wash & dry fabrics before you start. The girls love color, so any colour solid or colourful pattern in flannel will do.

IF YOU NEED THE PATTERN, YOU WILL HAVE TO EMAIL ALINE FOR IT. THERE ARE STRICT GUIDELINES ON HOW THE PRODUCT IS MADE.


What do we do now?

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
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
