IT'S FINISHED!

What a fantastic show we had! It is because of all those who were able to dedicate their time and effort to its success. Did you know that 47 members took part in sewing and assembling quilts of various sizes for the quilt display. The AHs and OHs that we heard throughout the two days of the show indicated that our visitors were not only amazed but bitten by the quilting bug.

Oh My! The Volunteers! What can be said about them? They were the glue that united everything together. Without them the show would not have been successful. They had a cheerful and enthusiastic demeanour which was infectious. They helped where they were needed and were our ambassadors of the quilted world. They set up different areas of the show and answered the questions of the numerous visitors. In all, we have calculated that over 650 people visited **Once Upon a Quilt 2022.** We did think we would have a lower attendance because of COVID but we are very Thankful to all those who enthusiastically came out to support our efforts.

Quiltique, Tombola, Marketing, Special Project, BHQG Table, Quilt Display, Christmas Stockings, Door Prizes, Featured Artist, Hallway Display, Hospitality Room, Admission Table, Favours, Opportunity Quilts, Vendors, Featured Artist, Finance, and Set Up Teams were made up of an extraordinary group of members known to us as the **Steering Committee**. For the past three years, they lead and motivated their committee members under very difficult circumstances. Our first challenge was how do we communicate with our members? At first it was very intimidating, but we persisted and learnt with the help of others how to navigate this strange beast called ZOOM. We met monthly from the comfort of our home and got to know other members of our guild. Volunteering does that to you. You get to meet and work with other people. What a bonus that is!

And on September 29th, we met at the Best Western Plus and, working together, assembled a **Quilt Expo** that was our pride and joy. For two days, we heard such beautiful comments about the efforts of all. BRAVO!

But financially, how did we do? Well, the figures are in. We managed to exceed our profit from the 2018 show by \$432.97. All of everyone's hard work resulted in a profit of \$5,060.04.

Phew! We have done well!

We, the **Steering Committee**, met tonight to close the files on our **Once Upon a Quilt Expo 2022**. We looked at all aspects of the show and reflected on what went well and what we can improve upon. We now wait to include these reports in our USB stick and will forward all of these to the new committee of volunteers for the **Once Upon a Quilt Expo 2026**.

Thank you to all members of **Brant Heritage Quilters Guild** who through their support and hard work, have help us show our community that quilting is a tool that we use to stay young and healthy.

Sew 'Em - Chop'Em - Sew Em Again Demo by C. Eagles

For one block:

one block:

1. Cut 2 15" squares of fabric and 2 15"

squares of a contrasting fabric.

2. Using the "two at a time" method, to


construct 2 hourglass blocks, and

repeat for the 2 remaining 15" square


You will have 4 hourglass blocks in all.

3. Cut as follows:


3. Cu+ as Follows:




You will have 4 hourglass blocks approx imately 133" 5quare




Find the centre of each side. Cut 24" on each side of centre.





Cut 24" From centre on each side of top tootom strip Rotate half square triangle squares by 180°. Sew rows together.





Trim to 122" square. Sew 4 together to make a 24' large block. (Finishes at 24")

For quilt: 16 blocks + 4 x 4 gives 962 quilt (square Alternate large blocks by contrast.




The Executive and all the committees are always looking for new volunteers to share the fun.




