Cathy is away in November and there will be no demo at the November meeting. Blocks from the October meeting will be due at the December



meeting. December Block of the Month will be due in March (since we are not meeting in-person in January and February—we will be on Zoom).

New Project: Because January and February are Zoom meetings, Demos and Block of the Month will resume in March. We will begin an exciting project to create 12 twelve-inch (finished) blocks to make a vibrant quilt with a black background and brightly coloured batiks. You will keep the blocks you make and each package in each month, at a cost of a toonie, will contain all fabrics needed for the Block. Blocks will be available each month, March to June, 2024, September to December, 2024, and March to June, 2025. Please sign up at the December meeting, so we have a good idea of the approximate number of packages we need to make.

Demos will focus on the skills needed for the blocks.

We are working on the details for workshops in January,


February and May.









